

Message one: Isaiah 6 verses 1 to 9

Introduction: This remarkable passage tells of a vision that Isaiah received when he went to the temple to pray. The passage can be divided up into the following thoughts.

1: What Isaiah Saw:

a) The Lord sitting upon a throne-- A place of royalty and power (6v1)

"A Heavenly Vision"

(Psa 17 v 15) (Isa 33 v 17) (Eze 1 v 1) (John 12 v 41) (John 17 v 24)

(Rev 22 v 4) (Acts 7 v 55-56) (1 Kings 22 v 19)

b) The Lord sitting **HIGH** and **LIFTED** up--- An exalted position; above everyone and everything else. (6v1)

"The bible often speaks of God as being High"

(Job 22 v 12) (Psalm 92 v 8) (Psalm 97 v 9) (Gen 14 v 18-20) (Psalm 113 v 4)

(Isa 57 v 15) (Micah 6 v 6) (Luke 2 v 14) (Eph 4 v 6) (Heb 1 v 3)

c) The Lord with his train filling the temple. (6v1)

(1 Kings 8 v 10-11)

d) The Lord and the Seraphims. (6v2)

2: What Isaiah Felt:

a) A sense of Great Personal sin in the presence of a Holy God. (6v5)

(Psalm 32 v 5) (Psalm 51 v 3) (Jer 14 v 20) (2 Sam 12 v 13) (Psalm 106 v 6)

b) A sense that all people were sinners in the presence of a Holy God. (6v5)

3: What Isaiah Received:

a) Iniquity taken away. (6v7)

(Ex 32 v 30) (Micah 7 v 18) (Acts 13 v 38) (Psalm 103 v 2-3) (Psalm 103 v 12)

(Isa 55 v 7) (Psalm 85 v 2)

b) Sin purged. (6v7) (Prov 16 v 6)

4: What Isaiah Heard:

a) The voice of the Seraphims -- Affirming the Trinity. (6v3)

5: What Isaiah Done:

a) He submitted to the call of God (6v8)

“Here am I send ME”

6: What Isaiah was commanded:

a) He received a command to EVANGELIZE. (6v9)

“Go and tell this people.”

(2 Tim 1 v 1) (Jonah 1 v 1-2) (Acts 22 v 14-15) (Jer 20 v 9) (Acts 4 v 20)

(Eze 3 v 17-20) (Acts 20 v 19-20) (Rom 1 v 14-15) (2 Cor 5 v 20)

*** It is important to note that only after acknowledging his sin and receiving cleansing could Isaiah be fit for God’s service. ***

Message Two: Isaiah 61 v 1 to 3

Introduction: A Portion of Scripture --- Packed with Treasures and Doctrinal truth, these verses also yield many other Bible Topics and subjects.

1: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH BIBLE PROPHECY.

a) The first coming of Christ. (v1)

(Luke 4 v 16-21) (Isa 42 v 1)

b) The Great Tribulation . (v2)

“The day of vengeance of our God.”

c) Israel’s Restoration. (v3)

“To appoint unto them that mourn in Zion.”

2: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH THE CONDITION OF SINNERS.

a) Sinners are Brokenhearted. (v1)

(Psa 69 v 20) (Psa 34 v 18) (Psa 147 v 3)

b) Sinners are Captives. (v1) “Of Satan”

(John 8 v 34) (Acts 8 v 23) (2 Tim 2 v 26) (Gal 5 v 1)

c) Sinners are in Prison. (v1) “Live a life of Spiritual Darkness.”

d) Sinners are Bound. (v1) “Are locked into the Lust of the flesh.”

3: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH **THE TRINITY.**

a) Two persons of the Godhead are mentioned in verse one hence indicating a Plurality in the Godhead.

4: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH **THE METHOD GOD USES AS AN INSTRUMENT OF CONVERSION. (v1)**

a) Preaching good news is used in Conversion. (v1)

b) Preaching by an anointed Preacher is used in Conversion. (v1)
“This is Spirit Inspired preaching.”

c) Preaching by a CALLED Preacher is used in Conversion. (v1) *“He hath sent me”*

5: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH **THE CHANGE THAT REAL CONVERSION CAUSES.**

a) Genuine conversion gives BEAUTY INSTEAD OF ASHES. (v3)

b) Genuine conversion gives THE OIL OF JOY INSTEAD OF MOURNING. (v3)

c) Genuine conversion gives PRAISE INSTEAD OF DEPRESSION. (v3)

d) Genuine conversion gives RIGHTEOUSNESS INSTEAD OF UNRIGHTEOUSNESS. (v3)

e) Genuine conversion gives LIBERTY INSTEAD OF BONDAGE. (v1)
“Religion brings bondage-- But genuine new life in Christ brings Liberty.” (Jn 8v32)

f) Genuine conversion gives COMFORT INSTEAD OF GUILT. (v2)

*****NOTE ALSO: (ISAIAH 55 Verses 12 and 13)**

6: THESE THREE VERSES TEACH **WHY TRUE CONVERSION HAPPENS.**

a) It happens because IT IS A WORK OF GOD. (v3)

“The planting of the Lord.”

b) It happens so the person involved can GLORIFY THE LORD. (v3)

“That he might be Glorified”

Message Three: Believers blessings in the book of Isaiah.

Introduction: The whole of the Book of Isaiah is brimming with promises of great blessings for the Believer a few of which are as follows:

Blessing One) **GOD WILL GIVE THE BELIEVER ABUNDANCE. (1v19)**

Notice that this is conditional on obedience.

Blessing Two) **GOD WILL GIVE THE BELIEVER FRUIT FOR THEIR LABOURS.**

(3 v 10)

See also: Isaiah 32 v 17-18

It is never a waste of time serving God.

Blessing Three) **GOD WILL GIVE THE BELIEVER SALVATION--STRENGTH--
AND SONG.**

(Isa 12 v 2-3)

Blessing Four) **GOD WILL GIVE THE BELIEVER PEACE.** (26 v 3)

See also: (Phil 4 v 6-7)

Blessing Five) **GOD WILL GIVE THE BELIEVER A HIGH LIFE. (33 v 15-16)**

“The believer will be living a life above the sin and the dross of this world-- Just like a high flying Eagle.”

Blessing Six) GOD WILL REMOVE ANY FEAR A BELIEVER HAS. (41 v 10-14)

“A believer should not suffer from fear in the same way as the Unbeliever does; because their trust is in God.”

Blessing Seven) GOD WILL NOT ALLOW A BELIEVER TO BE CRUSHED BY CIRCUMSTANCES. (43 v 2)

“A believer never need be overwhelmed by whatever situation arises because our heavenly father passes through them with us--- No need for Psychiatrists if our life and walk with God is right.”

Blessing Eight) GOD IS WITH THE BELIEVER EVEN IN OLD AGE (46 v 4)

Blessing Nine) GOD MAKES US BETTER THROUGH AFFLICTION (48 v 10)

“It is important for the Christian to remember that troubles are **GOOD** for us and need to be welcomed as windows of opportunity to grow in grace and faith.” (1 Peter 1 v 6-8)

Blessing Ten:) GOD REFRESHES US IN DRY PERIODS. (48 v 21)

See also: (Psalm 23 v 1-3)

He alone can lift our heads from despondency and despair.

Blessing Eleven) GOD WILL NOT FORGET US. (49 v 14-15)

“We forget him; but he does not forget us.”

Blessing Twelve) GOD WILL NOT CONDEMN US --- EVEN IF EVERYBODY ELSE DOES. (50 v 9)

Blessing Thirteen) GOD WILL GUIDE US. (58 v 11)

“He promises to guide and direct us in his ways if we will only listen and take heed to his word.”

Blessing Fourteen) GOD KEEPS US SECURELY (Isaiah 49 v 16)
